

**Cultural Information- Adiantum**  
(ad-ee-AN-tum)

Hardy to Zone 10 and higher for outdoors.

Partial sun to shade, grow to 10-12" in container, minimum temperature 50°.

<b><u>Light:</u></b>	Partial sun to shade (north, east or west exposure).
<b><u>Temperature:</u></b>	Maintain indoor temperatures above 60°F.
<b><u>Humidity:</u></b>	Preferably 50% or higher. The higher the humidity the better. They suffer from long periods of low humidity.
<b><u>Watering:</u></b>	Soil should remain evenly moist. Do not dry out. Fronds will be damaged by wilt. Plastic pots for ferns are better than clay because they hold more moisture.
<b><u>Fertilizer:</u></b>	Use low levels of fertilizer. Fertilize once a month with a dilute solution. Sensitive to high salt levels.
<b><u>Pruning:</u></b>	Prune damaged or yellowing fronds as needed.
<b><u>Insects and Disease:</u></b>	Highly susceptible to scale and slug and snail damage.
<b><u>Comments:</u></b>	Maidenhair ferns or Adiantums need high humidity and even moisture to grow successfully. When growing in a home situation, cluster plants with other plants on pebble trays for humidity or keep water in a saucer to ensure constant moisture.
