

**Cultural Information- Burbidgea**  
*(bur-BIDJ-ee-a)*

Hardy to Zone 9 and higher for outdoors.  
Full or partial sun, grows 1.5-2' in container, minimum temperature 60°, intermittent bloomer.

<b><u>Light:</u></b>	Full or partial sun, a southern, eastern or western exposure. Some direct sunlight is beneficial however; direct midday sun is too strong for best growth.
<b><u>Temperature:</u></b>	Maintain temperatures above 60°; they will tolerate cooler temperatures but they become more susceptible to diseases.
<b><u>Humidity:</u></b>	Preferably 50% or higher; however, they will tolerate low levels with no harm.
<b><u>Watering:</u></b>	Bring the soil to a state of visual dryness between watering however, they do not mind even moisture.
<b><u>Fertilizer:</u></b>	Fertilize sparingly, too much fertilizer can hurt them. Use ¼ tsp of fertilizer per gallon of water every two months of a balanced fertilizer like a 15-15-15 or a blooming fertilizer like Dyna-Gro Liquid Grow Plant Food 7-9-5.
<b><u>Pruning:</u></b>	Only prune off old stems once they have finished flowering and look unsightly, when plants get too large, divide them, which can be done at any time.
<b><u>Insects and Disease:</u></b>	Some susceptibility to mealy bug.
<b><u>Comments:</u></b>	Burbidgeas are excellent potted plants, bringing a burst of color twice a year. They are easy to grow, being only sensitive to excessive fertilization.
