

Cultural Information – Porphyrocoma

(por-fye-roh-COH-mah)

Hardy to Zone 10 and higher for outdoors.
Full sun, partial sun or shade, grows 6-10" in container, minimum temperature
50°, everbloomer.

| <u>Light:</u> | Full sun, partial sun or shade, a southern, eastern, western or northern exposure. |
| <u>Temperature:</u> | Maintain indoor temperatures above 60°. |
| <u>Humidity:</u> | Preferably 50% or higher; however, they will tolerate low levels with no harm. |
| <u>Watering:</u> | Bring soil to a state of visual dryness between watering. When watering, thoroughly saturate soil until a little water runs out of the bottom of the pot. Growing in a clay pot will help maintain a healthy root system. |
| <u>Fertilizer:</u> | Fertilize once every two weeks with ½ tsp of fertilizer per gallon of water. Use a balanced fertilizer like a 15-15-15 or a blooming fertilizer like a 7-9-5. |
| <u>Pruning:</u> | Prune whenever growth is excessive. They respond well to pruning. Deadhead spent flowers. |
| <u>Insects and Disease:</u> | For the most part, they are not susceptible to insects and diseases. |
