

Cultural Information- Zamioculcas

(zam-ee-oh-KUL-kass)

Hardy to Zone 10 and higher for outdoors.
Partial sun or shade, grows to 2' in container, minimum temperature indoors 40°,
blooms in summer and fall.

<u>Light:</u>	Partial sun or shade; an eastern, western or northern exposure.
<u>Temperature:</u>	Maintain indoor temperatures above 40°.
<u>Humidity:</u>	Tolerant to a wide range of relative humidity.
<u>Watering:</u>	Allow the potting medium to become visually dry between watering and then thoroughly saturate the potting medium until a little water trickles from the bottom of the pot.
<u>Fertilizer:</u>	Moderate to low feeders; fertilize every other week or once a month with a balanced fertilizer, like a 15-15-15 or lower.
<u>Pruning:</u>	Little if any pruning needed. If plants get to be very large, stem can be cut back to the soil level to maintain height.
<u>Insects and Disease:</u>	Few if any issues with insects and diseases.
<u>Comments:</u>	The Zamioculcus or "ZZ Plant," is a true indestructible foliage plant for a variety of indoor growing situations. Tolerant of low light, low humidity, and neglectful watering, this plant will survive where other fail. However, for the best culture, grow with some direct sunlight, water when the soil is dry, and fertilizer at least once a month. If given attention, it makes a handsome specimen that can add a foliage accent to the home décor.
