

Cultural Information- Hawaiian Volcano Plant- Anthurium
(an-THUR-ee-um)

<u>Light:</u>	Partial sun, an eastern or western exposure. Avoid direct sun.
<u>Temperature:</u>	Maintain indoor temperatures above 60°.
<u>Humidity:</u>	Preferably 50% or higher; however, they will tolerate low levels of humidity for a short time.
<u>Watering:</u>	Keep evenly moist by keeping rock damp. We recommend growing the Hawaiian Volcano Plant in a saucer of water.
<u>Fertilizer:</u>	Light feeders, once a month during the spring to fall. Stop feed in the winter.
<u>Pruning:</u>	Pruning may be done to keep a desired size or shape. This should only be done once flowering is complete.
<u>Insects and Disease:</u>	Not an issue.
<u>Comments:</u>	Anthuriums are great plants for indoor growing and flower under lower light and even shady conditions. In the Lava Rock they need to be kept moist so they don't go into a severe wilt. These plants are great for interior decorating. If flowering stops, simply increase the light level and flowering will resume.
