

Cultural Information- Anthurium
(an-THUR-ee-um)

<u>Light:</u>	Partial sun to shade, an eastern, western, or northern exposure.
<u>Temperature:</u>	Maintain indoor temperatures above 60°.
<u>Humidity:</u>	They are tolerant of wide swings in humidity, doing equally well in a dry winter home or a humid conservatory.
<u>Watering:</u>	A little dryness to the soil between watering is beneficial. Try not to put into a severe wilt.
<u>Fertilizer:</u>	As they are often grown in lower light conditions, a monthly application of a balanced fertilizer is all that is needed. Too much fertilizer under lower light will cause foliage burn.
<u>Pruning:</u>	Old flower stems can be removed and leaves that might get damaged; however, they generally don't need pruning.
<u>Insects and Disease:</u>	They are not bothered much by either insects or diseases.
<u>Comments:</u>	Anthuriums are easy plants to grow and a great choice for low light conditions. If flowering varieties don't bloom easily then increase the light level.
