

**Cultural Information- Ceropegia**  
*(seer-oh-PEEJ-ee-uh)*

<b><u>Light:</u></b>	Full or partial sun; a southern, eastern or western exposure.
<b><u>Temperature:</u></b>	Maintain indoor temperatures above 40°.
<b><u>Humidity:</u></b>	Humidity is not an issue as they are dry land plants that can tolerate wide swings with no difficulty.
<b><u>Watering:</u></b>	Allow the soil to become visually dry between waterings; err on the dry side. Use a well-drained potting mix.
<b><u>Fertilizer:</u></b>	Light to moderate feeders. Fertilize biweekly spring to fall, discontinuing in the winter. Use a balanced fertilizer no higher than a 15-15-15.
<b><u>Pruning:</u></b>	Prune anytime the vining stems get out of hand.
<b><u>Insects and Disease:</u></b>	Mealybugs and aphids can be a problem from time to time. Root and foliar diseases are not a problem as long as air and soil moisture are not excessive especially during cool temperatures.
<b><u>Comments:</u></b>	Ceropegia are easy and enduring container plants. Originating from arid climates they do well in dry conditions and tolerate moderate light and forgetful watering. Many species can be grown in hanging pots.
