

Cultural Information – Dracaena
(dra-SEE-nah)

<u>Light:</u>	Full sun, partial sun, or shade.
<u>Temperature:</u>	Minimum indoor temperature, 50 degrees
<u>Humidity:</u>	Preferably 50% or higher; however, they will tolerate lower levels without harm.
<u>Watering:</u>	Bring soil to a state of visual dryness between waterings. When watering thoroughly saturate the soil until a little water runs out of the bottom of the pot.
<u>Fertilizer:</u>	They are moderate feeders especially when grown under high light. Reduce feeding if grown in shade. Stop feeding during the winter.
<u>Pruning:</u>	They have an upright habit and in time can get too tall for the growing situation. At this time the plant can be headed back and they will quickly re-sprout and form a new lead.
<u>Insects and Disease:</u>	Few problems with insects. Root disease can be an issue if grown wet and cool conditions.
<u>Comments</u>	Dracaena are famous indoor plants used in interior plantscaping because of their ability to withstand the low light, irregular watering and dry atmosphere of the home or office.
