

Cultural Information – Juncus
(JUN-kus)

<u>Light:</u>	Full sun, a southern exposure.
<u>Temperature:</u>	Maintain indoor temperatures above 35°.
<u>Humidity:</u>	Preferably above 50% although they will tolerate lower levels without any harm.
<u>Watering:</u>	Keep potting media evenly moist. As they are bog plants they can be kept in a saucer of water. Don't allow the soil to become dry.
<u>Fertilizer:</u>	Moderate feeders. Fertilize every two weeks during periods of active growth with a balanced fertilizer like a 15-15-15 or a 7-9-5. Discontinue in winter.
<u>Pruning:</u>	Little pruning is needed. Old brown stems can be removed to improve appearance.
<u>Insects and Disease:</u>	Few problems with insects and diseases.
<u>Comments</u>	Juncus are easy plants to grow providing they are given ample water and sunlight. They can be used effectively in water gardens as well as the sunny window to bring texture and form to the garden design.
