

**Cultural Information- Miltonia**  
*(mil-TOH-nee-uh)*

<b><u>Light:</u></b>	Partial sun, an eastern or western exposure.
<b><u>Temperature:</u></b>	Maintain indoor temperatures above 55° F.
<b><u>Humidity:</u></b>	Preferably 50% or higher; however, they will tolerate low levels of humidity for a short time.
<b><u>Watering:</u></b>	Bring soil to almost dryness and thoroughly saturate media.
<b><u>Fertilizer:</u></b>	They are light feeders, feed once a month during active growing season. Stop feed in Winter.
<b><u>Pruning:</u></b>	Prune to remove old flower spikes.
<b><u>Insects and Disease:</u></b>	Little or no insect problems, root disease can be an issue if kept too moist.
<b><u>Comments:</u></b>	Miltonias are easy-to-grow. They will flower regularly when given adequate light levels. Do not grow in too much moisture. An open potting mix such as fur bark or orchid mixes can be used. If repotting is needed, do so when active growth starts at the base of the rhizome.
