

Cultural Information – Pinguicula
(ping-WIK-yoo-lah)

<u>Light:</u>	Full or partial sun sun, a southern, eastern or western exposure.
<u>Temperature:</u>	Maintain indoor temperatures above 40°.
<u>Humidity:</u>	Humidity is generally not a problem as they are sitting in water constantly.
<u>Watering:</u>	Always keep them sitting in a saucer of water. They never want to be dried out.
<u>Fertilizer:</u>	They are sensitive to high fertilizer salt levels. We recommend little if any fertilizer.
<u>Pruning:</u>	Not needed.
<u>Insects and Disease:</u>	Diseases do not affect Pinguicula and they catch insects.
<u>Comments</u>	Pinguicula are easy plants to grow. They only need a sunny window and constantly wet feet. We grow them in sphagnum moss and as they are small growers they don't need repotting very often.
