

Cultural Information – Pleiospilos
 (plee-oh-SPIL-os)

<u>Light:</u>	Full sun, a southern exposure is best.
<u>Temperature:</u>	Maintain indoor temperatures above 40°.
<u>Humidity:</u>	Dryland plant, does well in low humidity.
<u>Watering:</u>	Bring soil to dryness between waterings then thoroughly saturate the soil until some water trickles from the bottom of the pot. Grow a little wetter in summer and dryer in winter. Growing in a clay pot will help ensure a healthy root system.
<u>Fertilizer:</u>	Feed sparingly and only in the growth cycle of summer. Use a diluted balanced fertilizer no higher than 15-15-15.
<u>Pruning:</u>	Pruning is not needed.
<u>Insects and Disease:</u>	Mealybugs can be an issue if infected plants are nearby but generally an insect free plant. Diseases can affect both the roots and foliage if grown under continuous damp cool conditions in winter.
<u>Comments</u>	The split rock, like most succulents, are easy to grow. Loving a bright, sunny spot and a dry period between waterings. Takes quite a bit of neglect with ease.
