

Cultural Information- Anthurium Root Orb
(an-THUR-ee-um)

<u>Light:</u>	Partial sun, an eastern or western exposure. Avoid direct sun.
<u>Temperature:</u>	Maintain indoor temperatures above 60°.
<u>Humidity:</u>	Preferably 50% or higher; however, they will tolerate low levels of humidity for a short time.
<u>Watering:</u>	We recommend keeping the Root Orb Anthurium in the clear plastic saucer that's provided. After watering, the root orb moss will visually darken to a dark brown. After the orb is saturated with water, remove any excess from the saucer. The orb will lighten in color as it dries over a few days to a week depending on room temperature and sunlight. Once the orb color is has returned to a lighter tannish-brown, then it's time to re-saturate the orb with water. Don't let it dry out completely or the Anthurium will wilt.
<u>Fertilizer:</u>	Light feeders, once a month during the spring to fall. Stop feed in the winter.
<u>Pruning:</u>	Pruning may be done to keep a desired size or shape. This should only be done once flowering is complete.
<u>Insects and Disease:</u>	Not an issue.
<u>Comments:</u>	Anthuriums are ideal plants for indoor growing because they flower in partial sun. Keep the Root Orb at least partially moist at all times for optimum plant health and flowering.
