

Cultural Information – Trevesia
(tre-VES-ee-uh)

<u>Light:</u>	Partial sun or shade, an eastern, western or northern exposure.
<u>Temperature:</u>	Maintain indoor temperatures above 60°.
<u>Humidity:</u>	Preferably 50% or higher; however, they will tolerate low levels with no harm.
<u>Watering:</u>	Bring soil to a state of visual dryness between watering. When watering, thoroughly saturate soil until a little water runs out of the bottom of the pot. Growing in a clay pot will help maintain a healthy root system.
<u>Fertilizer:</u>	Moderate to light feeders depending on the light level. Apply once a month with ½ tsp of fertilizer per gallon of water. Use a balanced fertilizer like a 15-15-15 or 7-9-5.
<u>Pruning:</u>	Prune when it gets to be a large specimen. Little or no pruning is needed.
<u>Insects and Disease:</u>	Not susceptible to insects but susceptible to root rots under damp conditions.
<u>Comments</u>	Manage moisture so they do not get root disease. We highly recommend growing in a clay pot vs. a plastic pot for long term root health or pay close attention to watering.
