

Cultural Information – Tricyrtis
(try-SER-tis)

Hardy to Zone 4-8 and higher for outdoors.
Shade, grows to 1-2' in container, blooms in fall.

<u>Light:</u>	Shade; a northern exposure is best.
<u>Temperature:</u>	Hardy to subzero temperatures when planted in the ground.
<u>Humidity:</u>	They like a humid, moist enviroment although it will tolerate swings in relative humidity normally found in temperate growing areas.
<u>Watering:</u>	They like moist soil that has good drainage. Once established it can stand on its own unless subjected to severe drought.
<u>Fertilizer:</u>	Little fertilizer is need once established. When fertilizing be sure to use a low balanced fertilizer no higher than 15-15-15.
<u>Pruning:</u>	Seasonal pruning old dead canes will help keep the plant tidy.
<u>Insects and Disease:</u>	Generally free of insect or diseases.
<u>Comments</u>	A member of the Lily family, Tricyrtis like the shade garden and once established are easy to maintain. A yearly cleaning up and removal of competing vegetation is all it takes.
